

**System of Care Partnership (SOCP)  
Prioritized Needs – Updated October 2019**

Some kind of documentation available to families about service provision and transition.

Recovery Model

Warm handoffs after receiving crisis services.

Addiction services for men.

Huge gap in serving low income, domestic violence perpetrators. No Medicaid services available, all private pay, so it just doesn't happen. (I know this doesn't relate to the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual/DSM, but it is still a huge service gap and soon a provider gap.)

Reunification services for families exiting jail, or reunifying from kinship.  
Counseling or supportive services to help families re-unify.

Youth 6-11 years that are too young to incarcerate, to be left at home during the days, don't qualify for other services. (boys group-anger management-social interaction)

Non-Child Protective Services (CPS) involved informal kinship families where caregivers are aging and not able to meet children's needs. Family really needs a case manager to help navigate housing, childcare, health, etc...

Ensure Integrated Case Management (ICM) continues to serve as a collaborative community partnership focused on helping families access available community services FIRST, before high measures are necessary.

Enhance system navigators, including kinship and bilingual kinship, to improve awareness of and access to services.

Increase training for social service providers on stewardship of trauma informed strategies, vicarious trauma and compassion fatigue and other evidence based approaches, such as motivational interviewing, to help sustain consistence and quality in providers.
