Thurston Mason Behavioral Health Crisis Response System

If this is an emergency, call 9-1-1 or go to the nearest hospital emergency room

If the person is experiencing a behavioral health crisis, call Olympic Health and Recovery Services (OHRS), the 24/7 regional crisis hotline, at:

360-754-1338 or 800-270-0041

A trained professional will answer your call and provide crisis intervention and triage services. They will ask questions about the Individual in crisis and ensure the Individual is connected to the appropriate service (see below) and/or provide referrals to other community resources.

Mobile Crisis Teams

These programs provide 24/7 community-based crisis response services for:

Adults and youth who live in Thurston or Mason Counties; AND,

Are in crisis that cannot be managed with traditional outpatient behavioral health services alone **OR** are at risk of being hospitalized.

The person in crisis must have <u>requested</u> or <u>consented to</u> voluntary crisis response services.

Involuntary Treatment Services

Designated Crisis Responders (DCRs) provide 24/7 community-based evaluations of individuals experiencing a behavioral health crisis to determine if involuntary services are required.

DCRs have the ability, under state behavioral health laws (RCW 71.05 and 71.34), to detained any person, regardless of age or ability to pay, for involuntary hospitalization when the person presents a harm to self/others/property, or is gravely disabled and is at imminent risk, or if there is a non-emergent risk due to a substance use or mental health disorder.
